Monday 17 August

Arrive Zagreb

Upon arrival, you'll be transferred to the Art'otel Zagreb, where you'll enjoy a delightful two-night stay. Take a moment to settle in and, if you like, take a leisurely stroll to discover the charming streets of this vibrant city. Depending on everyone's arrival times we could always meet up at the hotel's rooftop bar for a drink, setting the perfect tone for the incredible Croatian adventure that lies ahead!

Tuesday 18 August

Zagreb

This morning join us for a morning sightseeing tour of Zagreb, where you'll explore the fortified Upper Town—the historical heart of the city. Discover the stunning St. Mark's Church, City Museum, and admire the grandeur of the Cathedral. After the tour, enjoy the rest of the day at your leisure, embracing Zagreb's vibrant cosmopolitan lifestyle. (B)

Wednesday 19 August

Zagreb to Rijeka (by road – 130kms)

Late this morning, we transfer by coach to the coastal city of Rijeka where we embark on the beautiful Le Cordea – our home for the next 13 nights. This evening, we'll enjoy a short sightseeing tour before settling in.

Rijeka is a city that beautifully blends its historical legacy with modern life, making it an interesting destination to explore Croatian culture, history, and natural beauty. (B/D)

Thursday 20 August

Sightseeing Istria to Opatija

This morning, we embark on a scenic coach journey to the ancient town of Pula, where we will explore one of the best-preserved amphitheatres in the world, along with other remarkable Roman ruins. For lunch, we will indulge in a meal at a traditional family-run venue, where you can also enjoy a delightful folkloric performance by talented local musicians and dancers. Following lunch, we will continue our journey to Opatija, where we will rejoin Le Cordea. Nestled at the foot of a mountain and adjacent to a beautiful nature park, Opatija is one of Croatia's oldest and most celebrated resort towns. Here, you'll find elegant Belle Époque villas, charming gardens, and historical landmarks that showcase the town's rich past. As the day comes to a close, enjoy dinner aboard Le Cordea. Afterward, feel free to take a leisurely stroll through the enchanting streets of Opatija, soaking in the charm and beauty that surrounds you.

Friday 21 August

Sailing from Opatija to Krk

Say goodbye to Opatija, as this morning we sail to the island of Krk, the largest island in Croatia. We will stop to enjoy a swim along the way. Overnight in Krk.

Krk is Croatia's largest Adriatic island, offering a diverse experience with beaches, clear waters, and historical sites like the Krk Town old town and the Glagolitic Trail. Known as the "Golden Island," it features lush vegetation, abundant sunshine, and local culinary delights such as indigenous wines and lamb.

Saturday 22 August

Sailing Krk to Rab

This morning we will take a wine tour to the village of Vrbnik. This quaint, almost medieval village is perched on a high cliff overlooking the sea. Upon return from our wine tour we sail for the island of Rab arriving mid- afternoon. Rab is one of the greenest islands in the Adriatic and probably one of the most magical. It is covered with pine forests and has beautiful beaches and is well known for its mild climate which differs from the mainland. The main resort, Rab town, is full of medieval buildings, built during the Venetian rule, dating back to the 13th century, the old town walls are still visible in some places. You will have free time to amble around and explore this particularly beautiful town.

Sunday 23 August

Sailing from Rab to Zadar

Early this morning, we embark on our journey to the picturesque coastal port of Zadar, an ancient Roman colony that once stood as a formidable rival to Venice during medieval times. En route, we'll have the chance to enjoy a refreshing swim at one of the beautiful islands of Pag or Vir, before arriving in Zadar by mid-afternoon. We will then take a walking tour, including a stroll along the famous Kalebarga Street.....As twilight descends, consider taking a leisurely stroll along the vibrant Riva promenade, where you can marvel at the enchanting Sea Organ and the captivating Greetings to the Sun.

Monday 24 August

Zadar, Kornati Islands to Sibenik

This morning, we set sail for the Kornati Islands where we'll experience magnificent views of 140 islands and islets of exceptional beauty, as well as small fishing villages and picturesque shorelines. Swim stop along the way to enjoy. On arrival in Sibenik we will enjoy a walking tour through the heart of the ancient town. The old town is a web of small streets and narrow alleyways with Gothic and Renaissance buildings, many dating from the time Sibenik was under Venetian rule.

Tuesday 25 August

Sail Sibenik to Trogir

Today we travel to Trogir, known as a "city museum" and listed in UNESCO's world heritage list. It is considered one of the best-preserved Romanesque-Gothic complexes in Europe, featuring a mix of architectural styles from the Romanesque, Gothic, Renaissance, and Baroque periods. We will enjoy a beautiful swim stop along the way. On arrival in Trogir we will take a 1 hour walking tour to breathe in the feeling of antiquity which abounds in this lovely town. After dinner on board take a walk along the vibrant waterfront promenade & enjoy panoramic views of the Adriatic Sea and the historic harbor.

Wednesday 26 August

Trogir to Omis

This morning we leave beautiful Trogir and make our way to Omis. Again, we will enjoy a swim stop along the way in a pristine and secluded bay. This afternoon we arrive in Omis. Omis is a small town on the Croatian coast at the mouth of the Cetina River, this charming destination is framed by imposing cliffs and the Adriatic Sea, creating a breath-taking backdrop in the Split-Dalmatian region and has a very ancient history as it was inhabited well before the Romans.

Thursday 27 August

Omis to Pucisca

After breakfast this morning we take a local boat ride through the Cetina river canyon to Radman's mills where we will enjoy wine, handmade bread and soparnik, a traditional savory Croatian pie from the Dalmatian region. Upon return to Omis we sail for Pucisca on the island of Brac. Pucisca is famous for its white stone - used for centuries in palaces and cathedrals and, most notably, the USA's White House. We will have an opportunity for a swim before visiting a masonry school, one of the few remaining such schools in Europe.

Friday 28 August

Pucisca to and Bol to Jelsa/Hvar

After breakfast, we set sail to Bol where we visit Zlatni Rat (one of the most beautiful beaches on the Adriatic coast). There will be an opportunity to explore Bol, or to take the mini train to the famous beach for a swim. After lunch, we cruise to Jelsa. Jelsa sits on the north coast of Hvar Island, framed by vineyards, pine trees, and a long, protected bay, one of Croatia's top island destinations. It's a working town with a strong local feel, where stone laneways weave between fishing boats and family homes. Once we arrive in Jelsa we will take a bus to Hvar where we will have a walking tour and take time to stroll along Hvar's waterfront promenade and through the Old Town's historic medieval and Renaissance heart. Tonight, we will eat at a local Pizza / Pasta restaurant. After dinner we will take the bus back to Le Cordea in Jelsa.

Saturday 29 August

Sail to Vis

Early this morning, we depart for the island of Vis. During WWII, Vis was Tito's headquarters, regularly visited by Churchill's intelligence officers who assisted with his fight against the German invaders, the British wartime airport and a local winery. Vis is known for its unspoiled natural beauty, rich history, and traditional Mediterranean atmosphere, which was preserved for decades by its past use as a military zone. We take a private coach tour of the area and visit the picturesque seaside town of Komiža bay where one of Hollywood's most popular works – the comedy "Mamma Mia!", was shot.

Sunday 30 August

Vis to Korcula

This morning, we set sail for the island of Korcula. The medieval Korčula Town is widely recognised as being the birthplace of the world explorer Marco Polo. The town has meandering cobblestone streets, cute little shops, and many cafes, bars and restaurants. A walk to the top of the hill will reward you with fabulous scenic views over the Old Town and out to sea. This afternoon we take a short guided walking tour after which we have free time to enjoy this unique town. This evening we will be serenaded at dinner by local acapelo musicians.

Monday 31 August

Sail to Dubrovnik

This morning we head towards the Peljesac peninsula and the small town of Trstenik where we'll have a wine tasting at the Grgic winery, made famous by Mike Grgic of Napa Valley fame. After which we depart for a quiet bay in the Elafiti islands where we enjoy a relaxing swim before sailing into Dubrovnik – the "Pearl of the Adriatic." Dubrovnik is a breathtaking sight, entirely surrounded by massive grey walls, interspersed with 4 gates, 3 forts, 5 bastions and 14 towers. Our ship will take us on a panoramic view of these majestic walls before heading for port. This evening we join the skipper and crew for a special farewell 'White night themed' dinner on board.

Tuesday 01 September

Disembark at Dubrovnik

After breakfast we bid farewell to our boat and crew and join our coach and guide who will then take us on an early walking tour of Dubrovnik's historic centre, includes entrances: Cable Car, Franciscan Monastery with the Old pharmacy. This afternoon we will check into the beautiful More Hotel for a 3 night stay. (B)

After breakfast we depart Dubrovnik and travel by coach along the scenic Adriatic highway to Split – Croatia's second largest city - with en route stop at Makarska.

Enjoy panoramic views of the city and the Adriatic Sea from this lush green park, ideal for hiking, biking, or simply relaxing in nature. Experience Split's lively arts scene, from museums and galleries to festivals that celebrate music, dance, and film throughout the year.
